

Remember "safety" as you're hanging those beautiful lights and decorating for the holidays.

Following are some important tips:


- Make sure all lights and decorations have the UL seal – and be sure anything electrical put outdoors is labeled for outdoor use
- Don't handle lights while they're plugged in
- Don't string too many lights together or overload sockets
- Never use cords that are frayed or damaged
- Don't run extension cords in traffic paths or over metal
- Keep trees watered
- Make sure lights aren't touching paper or metal
- Keep electrical decorations away from water
- Miniature lights are safer – and, they use less power
- When using a ladder, keep it away from power lines
- Always unplug lights when you leave home or go to bed
